As the new church year begins this month, I want to let the congregation know about our plans to continue the education and mission programs this coming year. We will miss Mike Daly's leadership in this regard, but we have capable lay leadership willing to carry the programs forward and continue the good work he's set in place.

Audra Darché, our Sunday school superintendent, has agreed to serve now as the Director of Education Ministries. She has already begun work to develop a comprehensive program for our Preschool through 12th grade, and engage people to help implement it. If you've ever observed Audra in her work, you know that we are in capable hands. She has a Bachelor's degree in Education and a Master's degree in School Counseling, so she's very qualified for this position.



AnDréa James, our Children's Choir Director, will be providing music for the Sunday school kids each Sunday throughout the year. This will include group singing, preparing for a musical, and working with individual grade levels for an integrated program.

We are in dialogue with lay people who will be leaders for each of the education groups, and I will meet regularly with Audra and the Board of Education Ministries to sustain this great program.

Val Flechtner, the chairman of our Board of Missions, has agreed to continue in her leadership role, helping to organize the various mission outreach programs we're involved in. She and I have discussed the various projects, and who might take charge of each one. I'm confident that our volunteer ministries to the community will continue as they have in the past. I will be working with Val over this next year to offer any assistance I can.

As far as Community Life, I've identified the various programs that are in place, as well as people who will take charge of organizing them. I'm also organizing various committees of lay people to serve in visiting the homebound, serving at funerals, etc. to assist me in the things I might otherwise not get done due to increased activity with the things I've mentioned above. Shelley Lund, our Office Administrator, and Todd Jones, our Building Maintenance and All-Around-Assistant, have agreed to help with extra duties as needed.

I'm encouraged by the level of participation and the eagerness with which people already in leadership positions have agreed to continue the great programs we have in place. As you can readily see, this will involve more of my time than in the past, but I'm glad to offer whatever help I can in order to keep things moving forward on a quality level.


HOWEVER, please let me know if you need pastoral care; I'm never too busy to help in a crisis, or make a visit at hospital or home to help where needed.

SOMEONE WHO KNOWS MY NAME...

She was eight. And she was invisible. At least that's how Sam felt most days. She would stand alone on the playground. She would sit unnoticed in the classroom. At home, things were hard. Grandpa had died. A new baby was on the way. She felt like she was being left behind. Like no one could see her...and worse, that no one really tried.

But then Kim, Sam's KIDS HOPE USA mentor, came into her life. Kim called her by name. She looked in her eyes. She listened, uninterrupted, to Sam's voice. And Kim

saw her in a way she thought no one had ever seen her before. In Sam, Kim saw a unique heart and creative spirit. A fun kid, undiscovered by her peers. A bright mind, overlooked in the everyday hubbub. A timid child, unaware of her importance. And through Kim's eyes, Sam began to see herself too. Kim's encouragement gave Sam confidence to step out and take a chance. Her reassurance freed Sam to be herself. Her time and her presence and her caring shined light into Sam's soul...and the sense of invisibility began to disappear.

Kim showed up every week. She called her "Sam," and she brought her black licorice jelly beans...because she knew they were her favorite. And for the first time, Sam felt important. She felt special and valued...for she had found *hope in someone who knew her name*. New England Church is proud to be in the Kids Hope USA program providing mentors to Greenman Elementary School. 
