Some years ago, a member of this church, now long deceased, told me that he never answered any phone calls from the church during November, knowing that the church would be asking for money for the stewardship campaign. Really? That seemed incongruous to me for this person was proud to be part of New England Church, and the concept of not wanting to support an organization that meant a lot to him seemed like a paradox.

A few years later, when we were discussing the stewardship campaign at a Board meeting, a woman was surprised to hear me say that Judy and I made a pledge to the campaign. She wondered why I would be contributing to the church that paid my salary and required much of my time. That surprised me as well; why wouldn't I support the ministry of this church with whom I have had a great relationship for over 31 years?

It is always a joy to support the organizations which provide meaning and purpose, not only for me but for the larger community as well. I find it a privilege to give money to the Paramount Theatre for the great art they provide Aurora. I'm delighted to contribute to the ongoing operation of St. Jude's Children Hospital through our Preschool Bike-a-Thon because of the healthcare they provide for children. I'm excited to give to Youth Outlook because of the advocacy they provide for the LGBTQ+ community. Likewise with the Red Cross, the Public Broadcasting System, and the Wildlife Federation.

All too often, we want to avoid contact with organizations asking for money, but isn't it part of our mission as people who have resources to support organizations that provide stability and stimulating programs for the betterment of a society?

Here at New England Church, our children learn what it means to include those who may not have the same ideas or religion as they do; here our children are affirmed for who they are without having to behave or believe in a certain way. Here people looking for a congregation who loves with an unconditional love can find a spiritual home. Here the arts are as important as mission outreach.

Another member of this church, Emeline Messenger, whose financial contributions helped establish and support the Messenger Library in North Aurora, always had this to say at stewardship time: Don't give until it hurts; give until it feels good.

So I appeal to you as we begin our campaign to underwrite the budget for our ministry in 2018, please give as generously as possible, until it feels good. This church is worth every dollar and every ounce of energy we can give to support it.






Looking Ahead: Our annual Hanging of the Greens Service will be December 3 at the 10:00 am service.

GET READY FOR WINTER DINNERS 2018!






