CHANGES COMING TO YOUTH GROUP & CONFIRMATION:

New England Church is in the process of searching for a candidate to fill our new ten hour/week Director of Youth Ministry position. Our goal is for this new staff member to begin work on August 1st so they can be ready for the 2023-24 ministry year. We are very excited for the opportunity to have a single staff person with more dedicated hours to oversee Sunday morning youth group, Sunday evening Confirmation Gatherings (in partnership with Brandon) and other youth events and trips. Though Desiree will no longer be overseeing 6th-12th grade, she will definitely still work together with and support this new staff person in anyway that's helpful. We can't wait for our students to welcome our new Director in the fall. Confirmation will also look a little different going forward. Beginning next fall, we will transition to a two-year cohort model. This means that all students in 6th & 7th grade will be invited to be part of the cohort together. They will spend two years getting to know each other and discussing the big topics of faith. After two years, they will all be confirmed together in the spring of 2025 (at the end of 7th or 8th grade respectively.) Watch your email for more details in the fall.

CHURCH SCHOOL CURRICULUM:

This past year we've been creating and adapting our lessons from a Church School Curriculum called "A Joyful Path: An Inner Wisdom Series for Young Hearts and Minds." This curriculum is published by the Center for Progressive Christianity and is designed for ages 6-10, which works well for our multi-age classroom. Joyful Path uses the Bible, biographies, and sacred texts and wisdom stories from around the world to teach interdependence, self-awareness, respect for nature, stillness, forgiveness, prayer, integrity, racial inclusion, and experiencing God. This curriculum has been an affordable and flexible option for us, and we will continue to use it for 2023-24 and then, with feedback from parents, kids, volunteers, and staff, we will assess our needs and options going forward.

Reminder: Because of the way we are shifting our staffing model in the Education Department to better meet our financial needs and to better align with our long term goals, the position of Children's Ministry Director will NOT be paid for any work in June or July.
