Dear Friends.

You know how sometimes there's a flavor or a scent that just seems to signal the start of a new season or a special holiday? 

## The Students of the Beloved Community

On October 1, 1952, Joe Black was the first African American pitcher to win a World Series game, Dodgers vs Yankees, 4-2. On October 2, 1967, Thurgood Marshall was sworn in as Supreme Court Judge, another Black first. On October 14, 1964, Martin Luther King, Jr won the Nobel Peace Prize, the youngest recipient ever. October 27, 1964,



saw B. O. Davis, Ir become the first Black US Air Force general.

October is a good month to reflect on the achievements of Black Americans, mostly behind the scenes, absent in the history books many of us grew up with. From Joe Black to Dr. King, they were all told by society that they should aspire to be janitors and maids. Today we know better, but we do not necessarily know enough.

The 1950's and 60's saw a lot of African American firsts. It took a while to get to the seconds, thirds, etc. Today we expect to see Blacks as accountants, professors, Aldermen, police and military officers. So, why do we White folks still feel awkward in Black spaces? What is to be done? Our New England congregation is still predominantly White. With so much to be proud of in our church, may we keep asking ourselves the important questions.


