
## From the Students of the Beloved Community **Committee**

Their descendants later picked a date to honor freedom from slavery. Two years after the Emancipation law was passed on June 19<sup>th</sup> in Texas, the last of the slaves were told they were free. Now July 4<sup>th</sup> marks America's independence and Juneteenth marks all Americans' freedom.
