Easter).



## Join the Choir!

The Argument for Joining Choir in September:

The benefits of being a member of a church choir (or many) are well-known. One can cite the health benefits (including lower cholesterol, according to one study), the improvement in social connection, the insight that it can provide to experiencing religious texts, and more.



Nonetheless, we often forget that the writers of sacred Christian texts consistently emphasized the need to sing—in fact, we are at times almost commanded to sing! Note the following, one of many psalms which tell us to raise our voices in praise: "Sing to God, sing praises to his name; lift up a song to him who rides through the deserts." (Psalm 68:4–6) It almost seems that there is no option but to consider singing or being in a choir.

Let us take a look at other perspectives in Christian texts. "Is anyone among you suffering? Let him pray. Is anyone cheerful? Let him sing praise." (James 5:13~14) James emphasizes the role of singing in praise and encourages us to sing when we are filled with joy. St. Augustine of Hippo takes this further, saying, "Qui cantat, bis orat" ('He who sings, prays twice'). If singing is praying twice, then it seems that we might offer the audience who read James's passage the possibility of singing in the face of even suffering, such as Paul and Silas did when they became prisoners. We are encouraged to sing because singing is prayer, intensified through its setting in a musical composition.

What we often need to be reminded in turn is that God sings for us: "The LORD your God is in your midst, a mighty one who will save; he will rejoice over you with gladness; he will quiet you by his love; he will exult over you with loud singing." (Zephaniah 3:17) If singing is an activity that God has chosen, and if the Bible is consistent in its exhortations regarding singing, then it might not be too difficult to suggest that it is something you should choose to do...at NECC. Consider joining our community within a community, our Chancel Choir. We meet on Wednesday evenings to rehearse (beginning on September 3), and we praise God with joyful voices on Sundays. We hope you will join us. (P.S. Another reason for joining choir is: we have fun, but that is a topic for another time.)

POP-UP CHOIR Dates for FALL 2026: October 12 and November 16 Please invite neighbors, fellow congregants, acquaintances, relatives, friends, and even strangers to sing with our Pop Up choir this Fall.

There are no requirements, and all we need to do is meet at 9:15am on the day of the service. Please mark down these dates and join us in singing a joyful song to the Lord.

#### YOUTH GROUP:

Youth Group is for students in middle school and high school. Students begin in the youth room (not the sanctuary) and start their sessions with informal conversation and games before they jump into the week's lesson. The main goal of youth group is that our youth feel welcomed, loved, supported, and heard as they also learn more about our faith tradition and the faith traditions of others. Youth Group meets weekly during the 10:00 service from the Sunday after Labor Day Weekend until the Sunday before Memorial Day Weekend -with the exception of a one week break the Sunday after Christmas. Youth Group participates in Intergenerational Worship and communion on first Sundays in the sanctuary with their families. Youth can also sign-up to be youth helpers on first Sundays. Students who have been confirmed or are in high school may also apply to be occasional volunteers in the nursery. Youth Group is run by staff and volunteers. 

#### NURSERY:

Nursery at New England Church is designed for children ages 0-3. Space permitting, 4 year-olds may also be cared for in the nursery, or float between the nursery and KIDS' ZONE space if parents and church staff think it's best for the individual child. Our nursery is open weekly during the 10:00 service from the Sunday after Labor Day Weekend until the Sunday before Memorial Day Weekend -- with the exception of a one week break the Sunday after Christmas. Our nursery is staffed by two unrelated background-checked volunteers and is located within the KIDS' ZONE room for extra flexibility to meet children's needs and for easy staff oversight and direction. For parents who prefer to keep their children in the sanctuary with them, we also provide a young children's area with quiet, age-appropriate toys, activity bags, and coloring pages. > PARENT CHILD PLAYGROUP for kids 0-5 meets Fridays from 9:30-11:00 in the KIDS' ZONE Room. Begins Sept 12th.

#### KIDS' ZONE:

KIDS' ZONE is a program designed for children preschool - 5th grade. Kids in this age group begin in the sanctuary with their parents and are dismissed after Children's Time. KIDS' ZONE meets weekly during the 10:00 service from the Sunday after Labor Day Weekend until the Sunday before Memorial Day Weekend -with the exception of a one week break the Sunday after Christmas. KIDS' ZONE kids also remain in the sanctuary on first Sundays for intergenerational worship and communion with their families. Our program is run by staff and volunteers. We always have two background-checked volunteers in the room. If you have questions or are interested in volunteering, please contact desiree@ newenglandchurch.org
